



SmP 2023

<u>Science meets Parliament</u> (SmP) is the major event hosted by <u>Science and Technology</u> <u>Australia</u> (STA). SmP brings together about 200 of Australia's top scientists and puts them face to face with the decision makers in Canberra. Participants include parliamentarians, staffers, lobbyists and journalists plus scientists from all disciplines.

Next year, SmP will be held across two parts including online professional development, speakers and training from the **7 - 9 March** and an in-person event at Parliament House on **22 March**.

As a member society of STA, SETAC-AU can nominate (up to) two delegates to attend. Typically, one delegate will be a senior member and one will be early career, within 5 years of graduating the last degree. The nominated delegates will be awarded with complementary event registration for SmP. Applications for SmP ambassador awards are NOW OPEN and will close on 20th January.
